SCHOLARSHIP FOR INDIGENOUS STUDENTS PROGRAM AND ELIGIBILITY

The imagery in this application form incorporates the theme of the 7 Sacred Teachings which include **love** (represented by an eagle), **respect** (buffalo), **courage** (bear), **honesty** (sabe or sasquatch), **wisdom** (beaver), **humility** (wolf) and **truth** (turtle). The teachings share the concept of abiding by a moral respect for all living things and provide guiding principles in the collaboration toward the restoration of cultural values, beliefs and practices.

Purpose

Our scholarships for Indigenous students work to address the education inequity faced by Indigenous peoples in Alberta by making post-secondary studies more financially accessible. We award 3 scholarships of \$1,500 annually to students who are completing their high school education and entering their first year of post-secondary study at an accredited institution as listed below.

Eligibility criteria

- Member of a First Nation or band, or has Inuit, Métis or Indian status as referenced on the Indigenous Services Canada website at <u>sac-isc.gc.ca/eng/1100100032374/1572457769548</u>.
- Resident of Alberta and living in the province for the past 12 months.
- Enrolled in the first year of any full-time post-secondary certificate or diploma program of 2 or more years duration.

All applicants must clearly describe their community involvement, personal goals and financial need, and submit 2 reference letters for evaluation.

- **Step 2:** List or describe your involvement with community or schoolsponsored events or organizations during the past 2 years—use the space provided on pages 5 and 6, or provide as an attachment to your application.
- **Step 3:** Share a short story of 500 to 1,500 words about yourself, including your financial reasons for applying for the scholarship, your educational and personal goals and how you would like to give back to your community—please use the space provided on pages 7 and 8, or provide as an attachment to your application.

Step 4: Complete the declaration on page 9.

Additional pieces you must provide include

- proof of your status or membership (for example, a copy of your Métis status card, Indian status card or band or First Nations membership card);
- a letter confirming your attendance from 1 of the accredited postsecondary educational institutions named within this application (most registrar's offices can provide this for you);
- a copy of your Alberta Education High School transcript; and
- 2 reference letters from relevant individuals or organizations, such as a high school teacher, someone within the Indigenous community or a program director or supervisor from an Indigenous association with which you've been involved.

Application deadline

The deadline to apply is Wednesday, January 31, 2024 at 11:59 p.m. Applications received after the deadline will not be considered.

When will recipients be notified?

Successful applicants will be notified by **March 1, 2024**.

Funds will be awarded by **March 31, 2024**.
